Duties and Responsibilities:

Programs

Assist in the development and vision of the overall WPTS Interpretive and Education Programs.

Oversee, review, and participate in the consultation, development, and implementation of programs with a focus on the natural and cultural history of the west coast. Highlight compelling topics in science, the environment, and conservation of local ecosystems with WPTS mission in mind (Inspiring through Nature).

- Lead nature guided walks on various sections of the trail.
- Enhance visitor's environmental awareness and stewardship.
- \circ $\;$ Evolve pop-up short topics to share with groups at the Lighthouse tent.
- Engage visitors in informal learning opportunities as they arise.
- Assist other scheduled guides or guest speakers as required.
- Network with First Nations partners to inform all programs as to cultural content

Provide a friendly presence on the trail, welcoming visitors, responding to questions, offering orientation and general information.

Assist with exhibit or display development including the designing of props and teaching aids to be set up at the Lighthouse "Discovery Tent".

Provide appropriate coordination and cooperative oversight for educational programs delivered by partner organizations of the Wild Pacific Trail Society on or near the trail.

Develop and maintain relationships with community groups, partners, schools, and other agencies as a public representative.

Assist with the creation and distribution of engaging marketing materials to promote education program.

Regular postings on WPTS social media platforms-aimed at public engagement, trail best practices, environmental stewardship, and event promotion.

Community outreach involving educational opportunities, and recruitment of future guides.

REPORTING

Collect important data and outcomes gathered through formal and informal measurements.

Prepare short monthly reports and a seasonal SWOT summary to the board of directors.
